From Pastor Anne

Keeping a Holy Eastertide

Easter day dawns for us with shouts of joy. Alleluia! Christ is risen! Our journey through the wilderness of Lent is over and the Feast of the Resurrection has begun. We move from the sorrow of the cross to the joy of the empty tomb.

So, what do we do to keep holiness alive now that chocolate, coffee, and the other things we may have abstained from are back on the menu? How do we take the wilderness experience with us as we journey into the light of our risen savior? How do we keep our hearts burning within us as the hearts of those on the road to Emmaus burned? *Luke 24:13-35*

Through the Church we observe Easter not as a day on the calendar or a one-and-done feast, but as a season. The season of Easter holds space for celebration and for a joy so great that it cannot be contained. And, like Lent, the season of Easter is a time of preparation for another great and wonderful mystery, the Day of Pentecost and the birth of the Church.

We spend the season of Lent recognizing our human frailty and working to ready ourselves for Easter joy. We fast. We pray. We confess. We repent. We do things to move ourselves closer to the vision God has for us. The season of Easter is a shift from the darker journey of Lent to the brighter journey of hope renewed. The Easter feast is not only about the resurrection of our savior, but also about the promise of joy in our own lives as we focus our attention on the renewal of life, given through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

I encourage each of us to consider choosing a special intention for the fifty days of Easter whether or not you had a special way of observing Lent. Here are some ideas you might choose from.

- Keep a journal (or make a list, if journaling seems like too heavy a lift) of at least one moment or gift of joy experienced each day.
- Devote time to the daily reading of scripture. See my article on page 2 about daily reading resources.
- Begin using a daily devotional. You will find Christ in our Home devotionals on the table in the fellowship hall. There are also online devotionals of all kinds available.
- Make a written prayer list and commit to a habit of setting aside time for daily prayer.

It is my prayer that devoting ourselves to the journey of Eastertide will be a blessing. Alleluia! Christ is risen! The Lord is risen, indeed! Alleluia!
