Sent Out

In the Good News from John, chapter 20, verses19-23 we read the story of Jesus' appearance to his disciples following his resurrection. Jesus greeted his disciples with these words *Peace be with you. As the father has sent me, so I send you.* This is just one of the sending stories found in the Gospels. Jesus' time with his followers was, in so many ways, their preparation to be sent out into the world carrying on his ministry of preaching, healing, offering forgiveness and transforming the world with his love.

We practice this preparation every time we gather for worship. We come together to praise God, to hear the Word proclaimed and preached, to pray for ourselves and for the world, to confess, to fellowship, and to share the thanksgiving meal of Holy Communion. All of this is preparation for the moment when we will, once again, be sent out.

As worship concludes, we are dismissed and sent out, with these or similar words: *Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.* We are sent out into the world to be the eyes and ears and hands and feet and heart of Jesus. It is an emotional moment for me, and I have been reflecting on that.

I see so much in each of you. I see your gifts and skills. I see you joys and sorrows. I see the heart you have for people and your compassion for our neighbors. I see your commitment and your faith. I see people who are a blessing to one another, to the world, and to me. Sometimes I see all of that through a few tears.

The old familiar hymn attributed to John Fawcett (1786) says so beautifully what we are about as we are dismissed from worship and sent into the world.

Lord, dismiss us with Thy blessing, Fill our hearts with joy and peace; Let us each Thy love possessing, Triumph in redeeming grace; Oh, refresh us, oh, refresh us, Trav'ling through this wilderness.

May we each be refreshed and ready for all our travels, bearing the love of God in Christ with us as we go.
