Life is Better Together

I wonder if you remember a sermon you heard in September 2024. Now, keep in mind that I suspect few of us, yours truly included, remember the sermon we heard last week, unless it was a wiz-bang message. The sermon I am referring to was preached by Bishop Paul Jones of Burns Chapel Freewill Baptist Church. It was the first time that all three of our congregations shared worship and it was a memorable day.

The primary text of the sermon was Psalm 133. It is called a wisdom psalm, and the opening verse says *How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity*. What a glorious message for all time, and especially in these times. It reminds us of the blessings that come to a community that chooses togetherness over separation and cooperation over competition. The community could be a family, a congregation, a town, or neighborhood, and beyond. This kind of unity often starts locally and spreads.

Over a year ago representatives from these three congregations began to meet with the dream of bringing Christians together from all corners of our community for a shared worship service. Just like we do on fifth Sundays, it is our dream to bring all the Churches in Sedalia together for one, big Sunday morning worship. We call ourselves the Psalm 133 Committee and have met at least monthly for over a year. Our numbers have grown to include about a dozen congregations who are all in with this plan and we are working to involve everyone we can. A generous benefactor has agreed to fund the venue, and we have reserved the Mathewson Center for Sunday, October 4, 2026. Worship is planned for 10:00 am, and just like we already do on fifth Sundays, we are asking other congregations to leave their buildings for one day and join us in worship and witness to the love of God in Christ Jesus. Oh, what a glorious day it will be when all God's children live together in unity!

The roads will be assessed after 7:00 am and the decision about continuing with worship or canceling for the day will be made by 9:00 am. The announcement will be made by email, by changing the phone message at Church, and through our Facebook page. Most importantly, don't travel for Church if it does not seem safe to you.

We will hold morning prayer via Facebook and Zoom if in-person worship is canceled. The zoom link information appears at the top of this page.

Come and celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany at Christ and Trinity on January 4th at 11:00 am. We will welcome The Rev. Canon Chas Marks of the Diocese of West Missouri as preacher and presider. He is an assistant to the Episcopal Bishop of West Missouri and a dear friend of Pastor Anne.

News from the Church Council

The council met on December 22nd. The draft budget was approved and will be presented to the congregation on January 11th. Plans for snow removal (Bible Baptist Church has offered to handle snow removal), shopping for a more affordable copier, developing a safety plan, and planning for the June 2026 Synod Assembly (online) were discussed. The scouts will have a lock-in on January 3rd. Bible Baptist Church will use the building on Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, and NY Day.

New in the New Year

Many of you have heard me say that Bishop Amy Meaux (Episcopal) has asked me to join her staff half-time. I have been the missionary for vocations in the Diocese of West Missouri for a little over two years now in a “quarter time” position. The reality is that it has taken many more than 10 hours a week to do that work and now the diocese has right-sized my position.

So, what does that mean for Christ-Trinity? Not too much will change. I am still your pastor. I will still preach and preside. I will still visit the sick and those who cannot get out for worship. I will continue to manage most of the administrative duties that pastors enjoy. I will still be active in the community. In this role I will be taking one Sunday a month away from worship. On those Sundays I will either be traveling with Bishop Amy, visiting another congregation, or taking a rest. On those Sundays we will have Service of the Word lead by someone in the congregation.

So, what else does this mean? As you will hear at the budget meeting on January 11th, this will mean that a greater portion of my salary and benefits will be paid by the diocese. The financial saving to our two congregations will be considerable. These times when many of our congregations are smaller and have fewer financial resources, we are meeting that challenge with this creative plan. I am so happy and blessed that I can continue to be your pastor!

There are many groups who will be using our building this month. Bible Baptist Church will worship here on January 1st at 10:00 am, and each Sunday at 2:00 pm. Our scout Troop 61 will have their annual lock-in on Saturday, January 3rd.
